Activity in Forestry

Activity in Forestry is a countrywide programme for sustainable forest management (SFM) offering continuing education and advising of adults in forestry related subjects. It is aimed at forest owners and forest workers, using mechanical as well as manual methods, and is the leading programme in Norwegian forestry for education at the place of work or near the participants' home.



Co-operation

Activity in Forestry is managed in co-operation with the Ministry of Agriculture, the Norwegian Forest Owners' Federation and the Forestry Extension Institute. The Institute takes care of the management and coordination of all the activities connected to the courses. The professional staffs at the Institute prepares all new courses including instructors manuals, curricula, time schedules, audiovisual aids, booklets, authorize the instructors etc.

Countrywide

The courses are offered all over the country. The agricultural authorities at county and community level, and the Forest Owners' Federation with their district representatives, co-operate about organization the local courses. Since the establishment in 1977 more than 140 000 persons have participated.
